RURITAN NATIONAL CONVENTION REPORT

The Ruritan National Convention was held at the Hampton Roads Convention Center in Hampton during January 17-20. John Buddenhagen, Mike Kirsch and Bill Robins were the delegates from Deep Creek.

All delegates attended all of the business sessions and took part in the educational workshops that were offered. Seven new directors were elected. Phil Bradshaw, the 2018 Holland District Governor, was elected as a trustee to the Ruritan National Foundation. James Mills was re-elected secretary and our former National Director, Linward Hedgspeth, was elected as the president-elect. Larry Cassell of Maryland assumed the office of president.

There were three proposed amendments to the Ruritan National bylaws and all three amendments failed to pass. Ruritan National had a net loss in membership last year of 845, mostly due to death. That represented a 3.54% decrease in membership.

The 2020 convention will be held from January 9-12 at the Meadowview Marriott Conference Center in Kingsport, TN.
